7 8 9 10 11	It is the will of our Lord Jesus Christ that His disciples should preach the gospel to the whole world (Mark 16:16, Matthew 28:18-20, Acts 1:8). Therefore we have organized to be a mission outpost which deliberately seeks to connect broken lives to a healing Jesus through education, dynamic worship, and significant relational groups.

16 17 18	The name of this congregation as registered with the office of the Idaho Secretary of State is Christ Our Redeemer Lutheran Church, Inc.
19 20 21	In addition, the congregation may also use the name Christ Our Redeemer Lutheran Church, Sandpoint, Idaho or simply Christ Our Redeemer Lutheran Church.

23	Article II
24	Purpose
25 26 27 28 29	The purpose for which this congregation is formed is to be a ministering body of highly-committed believers in the Lord Jesus Christ, each empowered and personally involved in hearing and doing the Word, in discipleship and fellowship, in worship and prayer, and in ministry and outreach of the Church.

31	Article III
32	Confession of Faith
33	
34	This congregation acknowledges and accepts all the canonical books of the Old Testament and the New
35	Testament as the revealed and inerrant Word of God, verbally inspired, and submits to them as the only
36	infallible authority in all matters of faith and life.
37	
38	This congregation acknowledges and accepts all the confessional writings of the Evangelical Lutheran
39	Church, contained in the Book of Concord of the year 1580, as true and genuine expositions of the
40	doctrines of the Bible. These confessional writings are the three Ecumenical Creeds (Apostles', Nicene,
41	and Athanasian), the Unaltered Augsburg Confession, the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, and the
42	Smalcald Articles, Luther's Large and Small Catechisms, and the Formula of Concord.

45	Article IV
46	Synodical Affiliation
47	
48 49	This congregation shall hold membership in the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod as long as the Synod conforms to the congregation's confessional standards set forth in Article III as determined by a two-

50 51 52	thirds (2/3) vote of the congregation at a meeting called for that purpose. It shall send its pastor and a lay delegate to the district convention of the Synod.

54 55	Article V
56	Membership
57	
58 59	The membership of this congregation includes the Baptized Members, Confirmed Members, and Voting Members as defined in the Bylaws.
60	
61	
62	Article VI
63	Organization
64 65	The congregation shall be governed by the Voter's Assembly.
66 67	Article VII
68	Called Workers
69	
70	Calls will only be issued to such candidates who are approved by the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod.

72 73	Article IX
73 74	Property Rights
75	
76	If at any time a division should take place on account of doctrine, the property of the congregation and
77 78	all benefits connected therewith shall remain with those communicant members who continue to adhere in confession and practice to Article III of this congregation's Constitution as determined by the
79	adjudication procedure of the Synod. If division takes place for any other reason, the property shall
80 81	remain with the majority of communicant members. In the event the congregation should totally disband, the property and all rights connected therewith shall be transferred to that District of the
82	Lutheran Church Missouri Synod of which the congregation has been a member at the time of
83 84	disbanding.

87 88	Article X Amendments
89	Amendments
90	Article III of this Constitution is irrevocable and may not be amended. With the exception of Article III,
91	this Constitution may be amended, by a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the votes cast in a meeting of the
92	Voters' Assembly. The wording of the proposed amendment and a written notice of the meeting shall
93	be mailed to the LCMS District office as far in advance of the meeting as is practicable, and shall be
94 95	mailed to every voting member at least two weeks prior to the date of the meeting at which the amendment is to be presented for action. Any comment from the District office received prior to the
95 96	Voters' Assembly meeting at which the amendments will be considered shall be made known to voting
97	members prior to any vote being taken on such amendments. Upon favorable action by the District, the
98	congregation shall be notified that the amendments are acceptable to the Synod and that the
99	congregation is entitled to continue to function as a member of the Synod in good standing under the
100	Constitution as amended
